

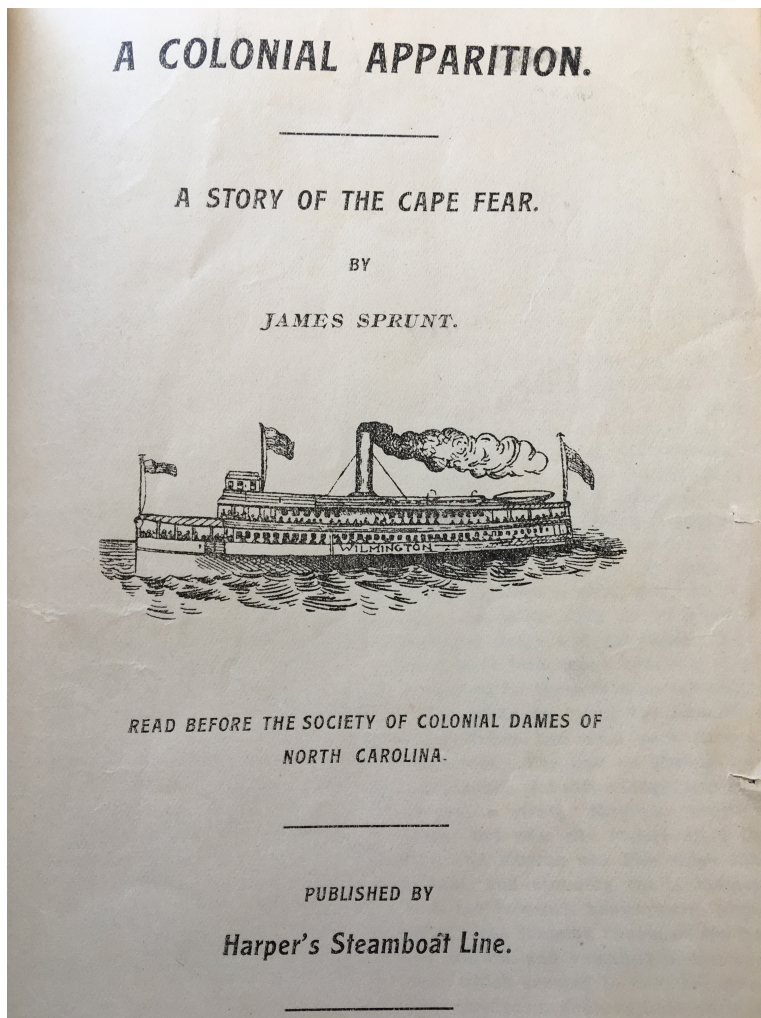

"A Colonial Apparition: A Story of the Cape Fear" by James Sprunt is a ghost story about a terrible storm

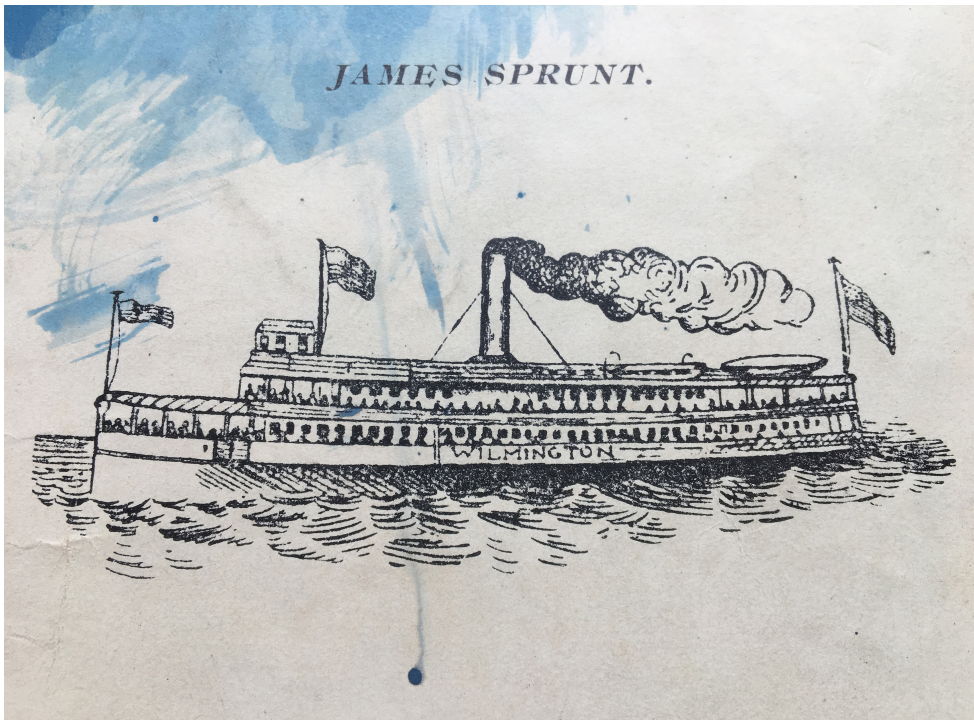
The booklet was published by Harper's Steamboat Line in 1909 and printed in Wilmington on the Mornin

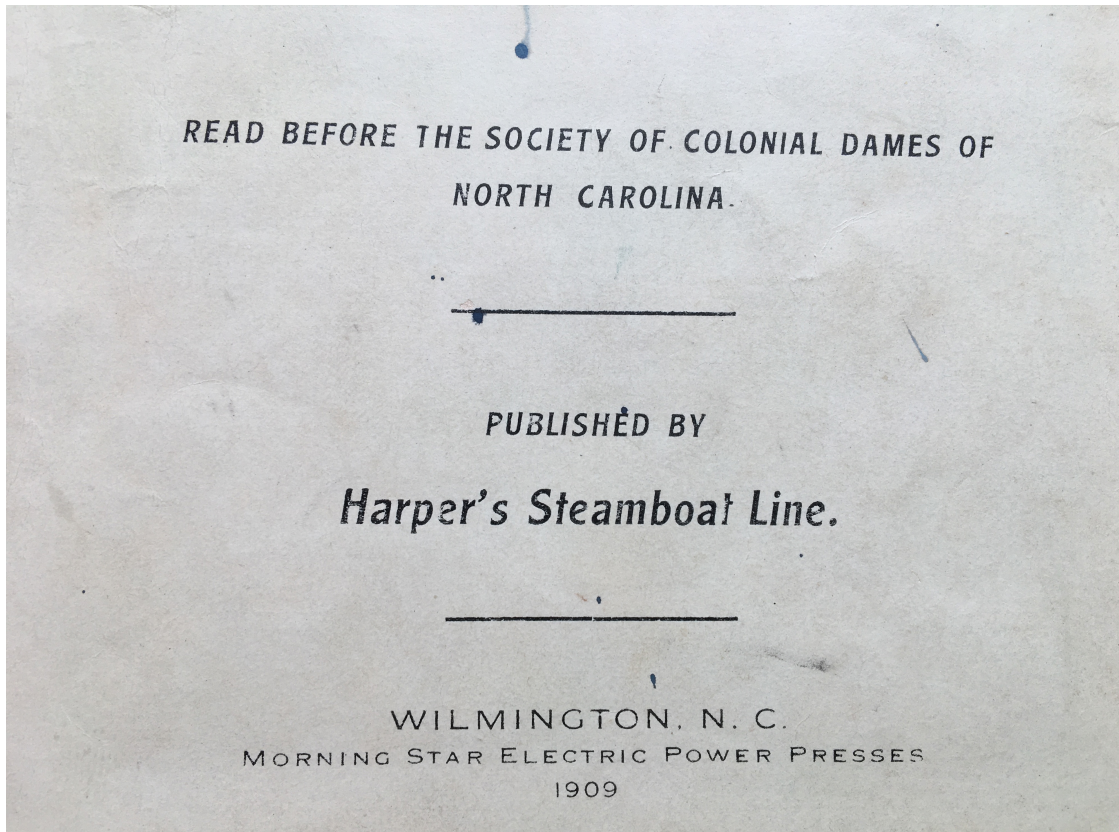
